Application

- We see in this chapter the beginning of the unraveling of the world in the Day of the Lord's wrath. And yet, we see 2 constants in v. 16: The Lord is on the Throne, and the Lamb lives. In a state of rebellion, this is absolutely terrifying (as His wrath is poured out). In a state of obedience/mercy, this is absolutely comforting (as His Lordship is clear and comforting). Do you respond to His Lordship with fear or with comfort?
- Remember that, regardless of what you are experiencing right now (no matter how difficult or chaotic), the Lord is still on the Throne, and the Lamb is still your Savior. And be comforted!

Application

Application

- We see in this chapter some pretty intense characters! And yet, there is something interesting and subtle listed in vs. 1 and 3: both the access to these creatures and the power of these creatures is given to them. This indicates that they do not have these things in and of themselves. Even in the light of creatures of whom we have never seen the likes of, they only have power because it is given to them, and they have clear-cut limitations. This is a great reminder that the Lord is in control! We as believers in Jesus can nevertheless be quick to blame difficulty on spiritual warfare or on the Enemy. Regardless of those things that you may think oppose you, do you remember that God is in control, and anything that you are experiencing is first permitted by Him?
- Trust that the Lord is good and in control, even in difficult circumstances.
- Praise Him for His care and character, in that He never arbitrarily allows us to go through things.
